

## **DECLARATION AS UNDESIRABLE**

The declaration of a person as undesirable is a measure ordered against a European Union citizen or a member of his/her family who carried out, carries out or in connection with which there are substantial indications that he/she intends to carry out activities that are likely to endanger national security or public order.

The measure is ordered by the Bucharest Court of Appeal, notified by the specially appointed prosecutor within the Public Prosecutor's Office attached to the Bucharest Court of Appeal. The prosecutor refers the matter to the court of law upon the proposals of competent institutions in the field of public order and national security, which hold well-grounded data or indications in this regard.

The decision of the court may be appealed, within 10 days from the notification date, the High Court of Cassation and Justice being competent to settle the appeal.

A European Union citizen or a member of the family of a European Union citizen may be declared undesirable for a period from 1 to 10 years, which may be extended by a new period within these limits if it is found that the grounds that have led to ordering this measure have not ceased.

Escorting the alien to the border or to the country of origin, by specialised staff of the General Inspectorate for Immigration, shall carry out enforcement of the decision by which the European Union citizen or the member of his family has been declared undesirable.

The right of residence of the person concerned ceases on the date of delivering the decision by which he/she is declared undesirable.
